JAMES, William, Importer of Fancy Goods and General Storekeeper; b. 8th Nov., 1845, in London, N.W.; s. of late Wm. James. Widower; m., 13th March, 1870, 2nd d. of late Wm. Thrash, Farmer, of "Melbourne," Camperdown; 3 children. Educ. Engd. and Natal. Came to Colony 25th March, 1858. Add., 202-3, Church St., Maritzburg. Was a member of Town Council, Maritzburg, 1887 to 1894. Took prominent interest in Building Societies of the City. For last 12 or 14 years has been a member of Committee of Management of the Girls' Collegiate School, Maritzburg. Prime mover in reforming cemeteries in Maritzburg, which till 1885 were a disgrace; started with the Church of England Cemetery; held office of Hon. Sec. and Treas., 1889 to 1902, during which time extensive improvements were effected and the grounds so well kept that other City cemeteries soon followed suit, and they also adopted the same system of management. Has been a member of Committee of the City Horticultural Society for last 14 or 15 years; Vice-President 1 year. Has been closely connected with Natal Church affairs during last 30 years, and was a staunch supporter of late Bishop Colenso; still a member of Church Council. Took prominent part in Church controversy (which remains unsettled). Was Churchwarden of St. Peter's Cathedral for many years; Auditor to Vestry 13 years.



JAMESON Charles Spencer; b. 1869, in Durban; 2nd s. of Hon. Robt. Jameson, J.P., M.L.C., ex-Mayor of Durban; m., 1894, Lily, d. of late H. P. Harrison, of "Rosehill Estate," Avoca; 2 children. Educ. Govt. School, Durban. Hobbies: Sports generally and horticulture. Add., of Jameson & Co., Manufacturers of Preserves, Condiments, etc. (est. 1868), West St.; and Musgrave Rd., Berea, Durban. After leaving school joined his father's business, with which he has been identified ever since. Was for many years a member of D.R.C., during which time he was the winner of several medals. Was Sec. and a member of the Pirates Gymnastic Club for many years; Committee of the Natal K.C. Was promoter and first Chairman of the Manufacturers' Association of Natal.



JAMESON, Henry Bentley, Associate Member Institute Civil Engineers; b. 18th Jan., 1866, in Durban; s. of Hon. Add., Civil Engineer, P.W.D., Maritzburg, Natal.



JAMESON, Hon. Robert, M.L.C., J.P.; b. 1832, at Kilmarnock, Scotd. As a youth accompanied his father's Regt. (the 79th Highlanders) to Gibraltar, 8 years; Canada, 4 years. Originally intended for a military career, but changed his mind, and eventually landed in Durban in 1856. A few years later started his present business, manufacturing preserves, condiments, etc., which now employs a large amount of labour, turning out goods which are known throughout the length and breadth of S.A. In 1868 first evinced interest in arboriculture—which has distinguished him since—by suggesting tree-planting in streets, whilst the several parks bear testimony to his forethought and contributions. In 1877 first watering-carts put on main streets, at his suggestion. In 1880 nominated for Mayor, but as he resided outside of Borough, was ruled ineligible. As Chairman of Sanitary Committee for past 22 years, worked most strenuously for improvement of condition of Durban. Has been associated with the Town Council for the past 30 years, mainly as a Councillor, and as Mayor 1895-1897. Since 1895 member Legislative Council for Durban Co.

JAMIESON, James Sprunt, F.I.C., F.C.S.; b. 1875, in Edinburgh; es. of D. M. Jamieson, of Durban. Unmarried. Educ. Geo. Watson's College, Edinburgh, and Edinburgh University. Jan., 1889, Ethel, d. of Geo. A. Campbell, of Hursley-cum-Place, Sussex; 1 child. Educ. Rugby School (silver cup for best cricketer, silver cup for best athlete, 1st prize for gymnastics). For 30 years a member of the M.C.C., during which time he often played for, and sometimes captained, the team. Clerk to Eastbourne Poor Guardians; Clerk to Eastbourne Rural Dist. Council; Supt. Registrar of Eastbourne and Dist. Hobbies: Sports, hunting, fishing, and shooting. Add., 13, Acutt's Arcade, Durban.
